Didactic Unit Number 1

Title: The Self and the Group

Aims/objectives of the session

- To develop a partnership relation within the group, preparing the individual to a more active participation with others;
- To develop expressive skills as a tool towards training and towards an active participation in society;
 - To promote Self-Esteem;
 - To discover oneself;
 - To understand the body as a way to relate and to express.

Used activities/Contents

- To present yourself loudly looking in your colleges eyes;
- To walk through the room blindfolded, promoting group mutual help;
- To develop improvisation exercises in groups of two, considering a base story (ex: to enter a jungle with a friend e try to handle the difficulties....).









Needed facilities/technical equipment

- A large room where people can walk, move freely, do physical exercises;
- A tissue to blindfold:
- Cd Music player.

Learning outcomes

With these didactic units the trainees will:

Technical Scope – To project the voice correctly, demonstrating confidence in communication;

Performance Scope – To be able to develop a free communication without constraints and inhibitions;

Experimental Scope – To reveal spontaneity and creativity in action and problem solving, thought improvisations and dramatic practice;

Academic Scope – To develop tools to improve the ability to work in group.







Title: Emotions and Sensations

Aims/objectives of the session

- To develop emotions and sensations valorisation in the contact with society and with other persons as a way to improve creativity and self expression;
 - To have creative competences through emotional inspiration;
 - To know yourself;
 - To promote emotion self-control;
 - To control uncomfortable sensations;

Used activities/Contents

• Perception and sensorial exploration (to feel the body warm, skin or hair, etc).



Needed facilities/technical equipment

- A large room where people can walk, move freely, do physical exercises;
- Music CD player;
- Lyric texts.







Learning outcomes

With these didactic units the trainees will:

Technical Scope – To develop the ability to create emotion or to hide them;

Performance Scope – To be able to show a neutral posture, a statue position and also extreme sensations;

Experimental Scope – To reveal spontaneity and creativity in life and in problem solving through improvisation practice and dramatization;

Academic Scope – To have more tools to face the tasks from the other training modules of the training course (reading, presentations, argumentations, etc).







Title: Body and Voice

Aims/objectives of the session

- To be aware of the body and it's importance in communication and information provider;
- To develop expressive skills;
- To embrace body and vocal originality of each individual;
- To discover oneself;
- To understand the body as a vehicle of information;
- To indentify in the human voice the person's feelings.

Used activities/Contents

- Exercises with different body rhythms and movements;
- Dance exercises;
- Free body expression from musical stimulus;
- Vocal projection exercises;
- Singing exercises;









Needed facilities/technical equipment

- A large room where people can walk, move freely, do physical exercises;
- Music CD player;
- Classic Guitar.

Learning outcomes

With these didactic units the trainees will:

Technical Scope – To project the voice correctly and to use the body in different situations;

Performance Scope – To be able to make a presentation for an audience without insecurities;

Experimental Scope – To reveal spontaneity and calm in actions;

Academic Scope – To use more tools to face the tasks from the training course;







Title: Space

Aims/objectives of the session

- To be aware of the surroundings (space and object) and its importance on the individual;
- To understand the importance of our surroundings in the way we feel;
- To develop the ability to resist to the adverse space;
- To educate towards freedom;
- To use space without inhibitions.

Used activities/Contents

- To use all the space in the room;
- To hide in any place in the room (under the table or chairs, curtains, etc);
- To walk in different directions;
- To use the floor as a work space;



Needed facilities/technical equipment

- A large room where people can walk, move freely, do physical exercises;
- Tables
- Chairs;
- · Music CD player

Learning outcomes







With these didactic units the trainees will:

Technical Scope – To show confidence in taking advantage of the space wherever it is;

Performance Scope – To reveal in a public presentation the ability to move and control the space around oneself (first for the classmates and them gradually to the exterior);

Experimental Scope – To revel spontaneity and creativity in actions and problem solving;

Academic Scope – To have more tools to face the tasks from other areas of the training course.







Title: Verbal and Non Verbal Language

Aims/objectives of the session

- To promote reading and the continued reading habits;
- To develop language in the expression/communication process;
- To develop creative competences through dramatic expression;
- To focus reading, theatre and the dramatic arts as a fundamental way to communication/expression learning;
 - To understand the language as a prime vehicle between people;
 - To use correctly the native language;
 - To express oneself with calm and clearly;

Used activities/Contents

- To read poetry and other literature in a dramatic way;
- To make nature and animal sounds during the reading;
- To practice over reacting as well as economy in personal expression and volume;
- To laugh out loud
- To imitate cry and anger











Needed facilities/technical equipment

- A large room where people can walk, move freely, do physical exercises;
- Poetry lyrics.

Learning outcomes

With these didactic units the trainees will:

Technical Scope – To project the voice, and to express more clearly and paused;

Performance Scope – To be able to perform a reading for others, controlling emotions and insecurities;

Experimental Scope – To reveal increasing comfort in reading and verbal, manifestations;

Academic Scope – To have more tools to face the tasks from the courses training modules.
